Blast From the Past: "My Friend Vance" - Part I By: Don Lambert (from the "Around Town" series)

Vance and I became friends when we worked at Paul Jones' Rose Drug Store during the 1944-45 WWII years. I was the soda fountain production superintendent and Vance was the janitor and also delivered call -in orders by bicycle to customers all over town.

Vance idolized the Smackover Buckaroos-especially Bill Bass, Sammy Furo and Tracy Scott—and never missed a game despite the fact that he couldn't afford an admission ticket. Back in that day, black folks (mostly men) were consigned to a standing room only spot within the dim recesses of the northwestern

corner of Buckaroo Field that was situated east to west along side of highway seven.

My friend Vance was always in his accustomed seat and I could easily pick him out (the third white shirt sitting on the second limb in the big oak tree on the corner of Arkansas Highway 7 and Mount Holly Road). According to him it was the best end zone seat available and it was free.

Twice a year, we delivered Rexall two-for-one-cent sale circulars to every house in Smackover by bicycle. This was a time when we knew everybody in town.

Professor L. J. Gurst was Smackover Training School's principle and Vance's life changed dramatically when "Professor" Gurst was hired as principle of El Dorado's allblack Washington High School. When the Gurst family headed the twelve miles south, they took Vance with them. He just happened to be the training school's top athlete and his dreams of playing football were soon realized, as he quickly became Washington's star player in football and basketball.
