From City Hall

We have had several people express a desire for City Council reports to be shared in Smack Talk. Mayor Bobby Neal has given approval for us to share approved minutes from the meetings.

Approved minutes are the notes of business conducted the at previous month's meeting. For Smack Talk, that means we will report the month before last's meeting. Confused? June's issue will report on April's minutes, which were approved in May's meeting. We will do our best to cover all topics as space allows. We would appreciate feed back from our readers as whether our reporting is acceptable.

From the meeting held April 13, 2015, and approved on May 18, 2015, all proceedings led by Mayor Neal:

Martin (Cross Oil) was not interested in the price agreed to by Council for leasing the old City Hall building. There was discussion for putting building up for sale with a starting bid of \$55,000 to be posted in local newspaper three times, and, if bid does not go through, possibly use it for a new library facility or other city business. Bids will be opened at the [May] City Council meeting.

The Council listened to information on Radio Read Water Meters. Hildebrand, Benjy Director, Public Works, invited Mickey Henard **Bonee** and Jeff Henard Utility Products, to speak about their product and services and how they would help Municipal Water Works expedite billing and give better service to our Mayor City. Neal thanked Jeff for presentation and then presented a motion to purchase ten meters and see how they operate for a four month period before changing out all meters. [Motion seconded and carried.]

Mayor Neal told Council to review the amendments of Vicious Dog Ordinance, and the Sewer Rate Ordinance would be brought back [in May] for review, as it was still being reworked and not yet prepared by City Attorney.

Fire Chief Rob Neal

reported that both pumpers tested and passed [in March], and that ISO was in surrounding counties and would, hopefully, be in our area soon.

Police Sergeant Robert Hodges reported that all was well with the Police Department and had nothing further to discuss.

Mayor Neal announced the City Wide Clean Up [which was held May 2nd], and also discussed work the City, School, Coach Strickland, and Little League members have done on the ball fields, getting them in shape for Regional games and the need for repairs to or new construction concession stand. Alderman Long has gained use of volunteered, portable concession stand until this issue be can resolved.

Various Council and community members brought up discussion about mosquitos water drainage issues, which Mayor Neal assured would be resolved ASAP.
