
President, drew door prizes, which added an element of fun to the event.



City Report Highlights

From the July 13, 2015 City Council meeting minutes, which were approved at the August 10, 2015 meeting:

Under old business. Mayor Neal addressed the Vicious Dog Ordinance, which was tabled at last month's (June's) meeting. Mayor Neal has talked to Animal Control Officer. Charles Hartsell, who gave him a copy of an ordinance used several cities in Union county. Copies of the ordinance were included in the packets for the council members review. Furthermore, the council may wish to add more to the ordinance before going forward with using it for Smackover. The mayor insurance spoke with agencies, and also met with Shelter Insurance agent, Keith Miller, to clear gain understanding whether or not they would insure pit bulls. Mr. Miller said Shelter Insurance does not insure homeowners who own pit bulls, and current insureds obtaining pit bulls are

cancelled, adding that the other companies they use to write insurance all refuse to insure the breed as well. Mayor Neal opened the floor question for and discussion with Mr. Hartsell, and afterwards appointed Aldermen Corley, Givens, and Long to work on a revision of our current ordinance by next (August's) Council meeting.

Recorder/Treasurer East gave the third and final reading (TITLE ONLY) the proposed ordinance, "An Amending Ordinance Ordinance No. 497". After final reading, Mayor Neal told Council it would increase the minimum sewer rate by \$4.16 and asked Council to accept the Sewer Rate Ordinance. It was accepted. Ordinance No. 512.

Only one bid was received for the old city hall building, and the librarian does not wish move locations, therefore Council decided to use the building for a community center.

Mayor Neal addressed

the Council on telephone call with Nathan Rutledge, Crew & Associates, concerning refinancing our current sewer bonds for a lower interest rate. He told Council that Nathan would meet with him on July 15th and he would bring that information the August Council meeting.

Additional concerns were addressed Alderman Corley about drilling additional water wills as a long term project, and issues over the police department needing new vests as the current ones are out of date and need replacing. Mayor Neal said water wells may discussed at a later date. The Council authorized Chief Fife to purchase police department vests.

Alderman Childers asked how the Smackover Municipal Water Department auto bank draft was coming along and Mayor Neal said they plan to start in September and the drafts will be drawn on the 7th of each month.
